Student life is mainly meant for studies. A student who devotes his full energy and time to studies is a good son of his motherland. India needs mentally alert and able young men and women.



The Cost of Celebration

It was 5th of September, 2024. This day is celebrated as Teachers' Day in India, in the memory of the erstwhile President Sri Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan. It is a day of celebration in schools as students express love for their teachers. This year, as I entered school after a hiatus of almost a decade. I was taken aback by the form that the teachers' day celebration had taken. The students brought jazzy decoration items to school. They adorned the classroom walls with balloons and foil streamers. There were several disposable plates and spoons made of aluminum films to serve confectionary items such as cakes, chips and burgers. One student had coaxed his mother to make maggie noodles for the entire class, they gave teachers gifts brought from the market. Each student had contributed a significant amount for this day. Those who could not contribute either did not turn up for the celebration or they sat in one corner. When I look back to my own school days as a student, I recount that we used to prepare various performances for our teachers. We gave handwritten cards and flowers to them. The teachers would gleefully accept the flowers and tuck them in their hairdos. I was completely oblivious to the form that school celebrations had taken. And it made me deliberate on two things. The first is, what is the meaning of celebration? And the second is, how should educational institutions celebrate various events? The root word for "celebrate" is the Latin world celebrare, which means "to assemble to honor". Celebrare comes from the celeber, which means "numerous thronged, or renowned". Other meanings of the word in Oxford dictionary are, to acknowledge with a social gathering or enjoyable event. It also means to take part in an enjoyable activity to show that a particular occasion is important. The teacher's day is an important day to honour teachers and acknowledge their importance in the lives of students. The teacher student relationship is the foundation of the teacher learning process. When this relationship is established, a student learns to make sense of the surroundings by being in company of a more knowledgeable other, to honour a teacher would mean to express how their interaction with the teacher has changed or touched their lives. When I apply these meanings to what I observed on the teachers' day, I notice a considerable deviation from the real meaning of celebration.

The activity of the students on teachers' day was more an expression of the mindset of the market economy. The celebration was a display of items bought from the market. There was little thought given to the teacher student relationship. The students appeared intoxicated with the consumerist mindset, they were convinced that just by spending money they could display their feelings. They gave little thought to the person for whom they had planned this day. There was lesser thought that went in for those who would have to clean the mess created in the classrooms after the party. The social science teaching could not create empathy for those who stand all day in the school to keep it clean. Even though we read about marginalisation and caste system in grade VIII NCERT textbook Social and Political Life, yet the students could not apply this understanding to their immediate context. The students cringed when I asked them to clean their classroom. Learning about caste makes us aware that how certain professions, such as cleaning the dirt, was done by those who were placed lowest in the caste hierarchy. In modern India, the notion of caste goes against the constitutional value of equality. Mahatma Gandhi wanted to challenge this caste hierarchy by reforming the education system, he envisioned that if manual work became part of the main curriculum people would develop respect for that work. However, today if we ask students to clean their own surroundings, they find it derogatory. This creates a deep chasm between our larger educational aims and what is happening in schools.

Besides lack of empathy for others, action of students pointed towards their lack of awareness about disposal of material they were using for decoration. They used balloons and other decoration items made from foil paper. The science education had not changed the deeper beliefs of students that foil paper and balloons are extremely hazardous to the environment. Children should be able to categorise various materials as biodegradable and those which ones are not. We must be able to analyse the impact of our negligence on the environment.

My observations indicated that we as educators could not teach our students the meaning of relationship. we know that relationships grow by love, compassion, consideration and generosity. And we can express these by using words and gestures. The mark of an educated person is their ability to use words to demonstrate their feelings. The language teaching must empower children by giving them a rich






